



1. Ice cream is always a popular treat in the holidays.

Ask your child to pick their perfect ice cream. They can pick up to three different flavours.






At the end of the lesson, everyone admired Mark's work.

He wondered where it might end up next!





Nature notes for June




As we begin our last week of school in P4, take some time to reflect on how lucky we have been this year.
